Types of Assistantships: The ETSU Math Department offers three types of graduate assistantships. “First year” assistantships may require a 20 hour per week assignment to a professor or to the Math Lab or the Math Technology Classroom, depending on the skills of the individual student. These assistantships pay (as of 2002) \$7,200. “Second year” graduate students with 18 hours of graduate math credit frequently are assigned to teach two freshman level mathematics classes. These assistantships pay (as of 2002) \$8,200. Both of these types of assistantships are for nine month contracts and come with a tuition waiver for fall and spring semesters. The department also offers “Math Lab” assistantships which come with a stipend of \$10,250 for a 12 month contract. These assistantships come with a tuition waiver for fall and spring, but students are required to pay tuition during the summer terms. There are four of each of these three types of assistantships available. The department also has four tuition waivers available (covering fall and spring semesters) which require eight hours per week of service.

Deadlines: Your application for an assistantship cannot be considered until your application to the graduate school is completed (including the registration fee). The preferred date of receipt of your application is mid-March for full consideration of an assistantship which starts in the fall, and mid-November for consideration of an assistantship which starts in the spring. Applications received latter will also be considered, but you should be aware that there may be limited availability of assistantships some years.
